The **Northwestern University** Emeriti Organization (**NEO**) won for thier Mini-Courses for residents of Evanston and surrounding Communities.













In 2005 I became the editor of the ARF Newsletter of 8 pages, front and back pages could be in color. It mainly consisted of a letter from the President, Calendar for the year, comments from various committee chairs, a few photos and a list of officers with their information.



By 2010 the ARF Newsletter included 8 pages with more color. There were some additional special features added. The only photos were of the Board in Action.

The ARF Newsletter became a 32 page Journal in full color in September of 2013. The cover featured the Building where the Provost's Office gave us 4 furnished offices to be used by the Journal Editor and other ARF Officers. Featured articles included a report of the AROHE Conference, fund raising volunteers for the University TV and Radio Stations, FSU – Ollie Program, ARF Barbeque event (photos of people attending), Spring Luncheon (photos of people attending), ARF Stars (people receiving special awards), Southern Scholarship Program article, University Library System Website article, new Honors, Fellows and Scholars Building (with photo of building), article about Retiree stained glass window in the FSU Heritage Museum, and concluding with list of past presidents and officers information list.





There are three (3) Journals per year, August, November and February. The Fall Journal includes photos from the Barbeque, Spring Luncheon and any special articles for the coming year, as well as all the normal features.

The November Journal advertises the Barbeque and Holiday Celebration (Retired Faculty and Senators are invited to the FSU President's House for this celebration). It also includes a photo and information about the Spring Luncheon Speaker, In Memorium Pages (list of retired faculty and staff who died in the past year), AROHE Information, volunteering opportunities, special article (FSU Study Centre in London and other special articles), ARF Fall Luncheon Photos and the normal features of each Journal. In February we emphasize the Spring Barbeque and Luncheon (speaker, with photo and article), Nominating Committee Report, AROHE article, State of the University by President Thrasher, Holiday Reception photos, volunteering opportunities, any other special feature articles by faculty and/or staff, concluding with the normal features of each Journal.

This "Special Feature" highlighted Fanchon Funk's participation in England with the Regal Swans Research Team.








Stained Glass Window Dedication

I am pleased to recommend that Florida State University Association for Retired Faculty and Staff (ARF) journal and website be considered as the recipient of the Innovation Award.

As background, when Tom Hart became editor in 2005, the ARF produced a mostly black and white 8-page newsletter with a color cover which contained a letter from the President and comments from committee chairs highlighting activities and events. Photos were stored in boxes and passed on to the next historian. With help from the ARF board members, ARF Journal Editor Tom Hart has been responsible for transforming the newsletter into a high quality journal which provides both collaboration and connection among our retired faculty and staff, as well as informs the entire FSU community of ongoing activities among some of our most valuable resources.

In more recent years it has been a priority to develop a first rate website for ARF. The website and archived journals can be viewed at http://reiredfaculty.fsu.edu/.

Due to the expense of printing glossy copies for the Retiree Journal, the FSU Association of Retired Faculty has worked hard to cut the costs of publication and keep the quality of information. Since the fall of 2020, the August issue is a 24-page digital edition of the Retiree Journal, with a 16-page glossy edition distributed to FSU retirees.
